Quick Guide for Faculty

What is EchoVideo?

EchoVideo enables creating, uploading, and hosting lecture recordings. It captures from multiple audio/video sources, is accessible via Canvas, and offers interactive tools to enhance student engagement

Create Lectures

- **Classroom Capture:** Record or stream lectures from any classroom. Start recordings manually or schedule with ITS.
- **Personal Lectures:** Record from your office or home using [Universal Capture Personal](#), the desktop app, or the [Browser Capture](#). Utilize [our custom Lightboard or multi-touch computer](#) for handwritten notes.
- **Integration:** Opt in to copy Teams, OneDrive and Zoom recordings to your Echo Library or access EchoVideo in Teams.
- **Upload Content:** Upload existing videos and slides from your computer.

Manage Content

- **Media Management:** Organize, edit, share, or delete media in your EchoVideo Library. Opt-in for content and engagement notifications.
- **Sharing:** Share media [individually](#) or via [Collections](#). Set permissions for other EchoVideo users, including custom roles.

Edit Content

- **Video Editor:** Trim, cut and combine videos. Break long lectures into bite-size segments.
- **Transcripts:** Edit transcripts yourself or grant permission to others. Accurate transcripts are **ADA Compliant** and meet all learning needs. Closed Captioning is available when the transcript is 99% accurate.

Share Content

- Share media with students using the [Active Learning Platform](#) or [embed individual videos in Modules](#).
- Instructors can monitor student participation through video views, poll responses and engagement analytics.

Improve Student Engagement

- **Interactivity:** [Embed Polls in any video or PowerPoint](#).
- **Lecture Tools:** Use Discussion, Q&A and Confusion flags to facilitate participation before, during (Live Stream), and after class.

Faculty Advantages



REUSE previous media for future use.

SCHEDULE/LIVE STREAM recordings of your classes so students can attend when unexpected circumstances arise.

CREATE personal recordings of class lectures or supplemental lessons.

MANAGE your media and share with other faculty.

ARCHIVE and RECOVER deleted videos up to 90 days. Presentations and polls cannot be restored at this time.

EDIT your media with the video editor or transcript editor, before making it available to students.

SHARE media to Canvas using the Active Learning Platform or **EMBED** videos in Modules.

UPLOAD existing content like a PowerPoint or PDF and **EMBED** polling slides.

TRACK student **ENGAGEMENT** and view media **ANALYTICS**.

Personal Lecture Capture - Tips

Practice Before Recording

- Before creating a video familiarize yourself with the script or slides to ensure a smooth flow and to estimate your video duration.

Prepare in Advance

- Rehearse the script.
- Install and set up recording sources such as your screen, microphone, and camera (webcam or document camera).

Test the Technology

- Record a practice video with the planned sources and files.
- Check equipment functionality with a 15 second test.

Short Videos are Valuable

- Break content into smaller subtopics and create multiple shorter videos (5-15 minutes) to enhance student engagement.
- Shorter videos are easier to consume and promote better engagement.
- Use short videos to supplement lengthy text where possible.

Active Learning Platform (ALP)



New Color Theme and Class Media Icons
(Raspberry, black, and dark grey)

White/black icons indicate the media is available in the class for students to view.

Dark grey icons indicated media is available in a Class but is not viewable to students.

Raspberry icons will be seen when a class has Live Stream enabled and when there is an empty class (plus icon) media can be added.

Class media icons are found to the right of the class title, where you can edit the title, view the number of discussions, and delete a class. Scheduled classes cannot be deleted.

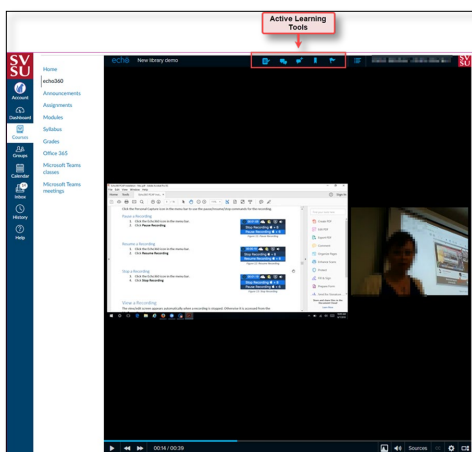
Media icons can be clicked on to manage the media for the class or open the editing tools.

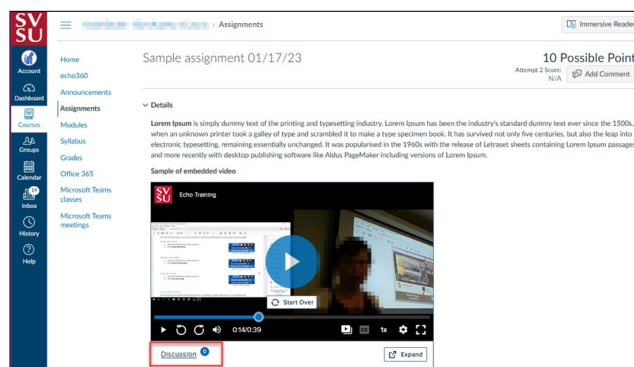
Located in the Canvas course menu.
